

Scripps Institution of Oceanography Volunteer Newsletter A Summary of the 2017 Sampling Season

Greetings CCFRP Volunteers,

With your help, we successfully completed our first year of collaborative data collection in southern California! In our inaugural year we had 110 volunteer anglers join us on 12 hook-and-line surveys conducted inside MPAs and nearby reference areas off Laguna Beach and San Diego. Volunteers spent 400 angler hours catching and releasing 1,123 fish (809 of these were tagged) representing 37 different species and allowing us to gather important information on species composition, lengths, and catch rates! Thank you!!

California Halibut 72 cm (28 in) Adam Ho, Swami's MPA


California Sheephead 62 cm (24 in) Martin Frederickson, Laguna Beach MPA



Tags are white, about 2 inches long.


